



W/C 13.07.2020: Learning Project – Ancient Greeks

Age Range: Y3/4

Weekly Reading Tasks	Weekly Spelling Tasks
Monday - Your child can continue to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.	Monday - Encourage your child to practise the Year 3/4 Statutory Spellings (Google: Year 3/4 Statutory Spellings)
Tuesday - After this, ask your child to write a short review detailing their likes and dislikes about the novel so far. Encourage them to justify their opinion with examples from the text.	Tuesday - Ask your child to choose 5 spelling words. They can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence.
Wednesday - Encourage your child to record any words that have captured their interest from the chapter that they have read. They can write synonyms and antonyms for these words.	Wednesday - Practise spellings on Spelling Frame.
Thursday - Challenge your child to read to another member of the family. This doesn't have to be a book so they can be as imaginative as they wish.	Thursday - Your child can create a vocabulary bank about The Ancient Greeks. They may want to use this for some of their writing tasks this week.
Friday - Your child can visit authorfy to access videos, author masterclasses and other activities over the next few weeks.	Friday - Get your child to proofread their writing from the day. They can use a dictionary to check the spelling of any words that they found challenging.
Weekly Writing Tasks	Weekly Maths Tasks
Monday - Research as much as you can using books or the internet on being an Ancient Greek. This will inform the rest of this week's writing tasks. Write the facts that you discover as a fact file with drawn pictures. Try to fill a side of A4 paper.	Monday - Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything you know about multiplication. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative and colourful as they want to be.
Tuesday - Ask your child to write a diary entry from an Ancient Greek citizen's point of view. What was their job? What was their home like?	Tuesday - Ask your child to practise their times tables skills. See if they can remember the times table they were on at school and encourage them to write it out.
Wednesday - Write a poem about The Olympics, you may even want to perform it too.	Wednesday - Daily arithmetic for different areas of maths. Your child should aim to work on level 1, 2 and 3 activities.
Thursday - Write a very simple Greek myth: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/z87tn39/articles/zqt7mp3	Thursday - Play ' Hit the button ' to improve mental arithmetic skills.
Friday - Write a newspaper article with pictures describing the victory of the Athenians at The Battle of Marathon: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/z87tn39/articles/zckr4wx	Friday - Get your child to work on their problem-solving by playing these games

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the Ancient Greeks.

- **Task One-** Using an atlas, can you find the main physical features of Greece? Try to find the mountains, seas, rivers and bordering countries.
- **Task Two-** Ancient Greece was not a single country/empire united under a single government; it is made up of city states. Research one city state, e.g. Athens, Sparta, and display your findings on a poster.

- **Task Five-** Why did the Ancient Greeks go to the temples? Can you find out the names of the any famous Greek temples? Now design your own with similar features, such as columns.
